The calculations on this chart assume that the first \$200 donation receives the 15% federal tax credit.
If \$200 or more has already been given to a charity, then the savings generated by further giving to United Way increases substantially.
The figures on this chart are approximate.

For donations made after March 20, 2013, qualifying first time donors may receive an additional federal tax credit of 25% on the first \$1,000 of monetary donations.

Effective December 7, 2015, donations made in 2016 may receive an additional federal credit depending upon the individual's taxable income.
Donations in excess of \$200 may receive a 33% credit rate, but only to the extent that the individual's taxable income exceeds \$200,000.
For any donations made in excess of \$200 where the individual's taxable income is less than \$200,000, a 29% credit will continue to apply.
